Character Strong "Trait of the Month"

This month's focus is **Respect**. One way to think about Respect is "seeing value in all people and things & treating them with care." Many people feel Respected in different ways, and we hope this month inspires discussions with your family about what Respect means to you and how you can practice it together!

Respect is 1 of 3 traits we will focus on throughout the year that helps students **Be Kind**. Throughout the school, students will be developing skills like perspective-taking, conflict resolution, and leadership.





Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS)

MTSS is an instructional system with tiered infrastructure that uses data to match academic and social emotional supports to address the needs of the whole child. Using Universal Design for Learning, differentiation and integrated academic, social-emotional and behavioral supports at all levels, MTSS provides a proactive, responsive and equitable system of support. MTSS at Robison provides direct support to staff and students in order to help further the vision and mission of the school.

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

The Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports program is based upon a philosophy of recognizing positive contributions of students. Our goal is to help each child develop self discipline. The home and school share the responsibility for developing good citizens. Parents, teachers and students must work together to maintain a positive learning environment.

As a part of PBIS, teachers, administrators, counselors, and support staff will have the responsibility to TEACH positive behavior expectations to students. PBIS means students will know exactly what is expected of them. Students who take responsibility to behave positively will be recognized and rewarded in a variety of ways (Beep Beep Bucks, monthly awards, etc.). Students will also know the consequences that will result when they choose NOT to meet the school-wide expectations. **Robison Roadrunners are Respectful, Responsible, Safe and Kind** everywhere on campus!
