## Principal Report

February 2025

- Stories That Soar kick off assembly was January 21, Magic Box will be picked up after school on February 14, Performances will be in March
- I attended the Step-Up night at the TCC on January 23, two families took information and scheduled tours – no 5<sup>th</sup> grade students from Robison came to my table
- January 29, all teachers had an all-day student engagement training and on January 30 or 31 - all teachers took the district-offered Success Criteria training
- Project Momentum conducted a walkthrough and we scored either similar or higher in each area. We will be receiving monies and professional development from this grant beginning next year and walkthroughs will be scheduled every month beginning next year.
- Peter Piper Pizza Fundraiser - brought in \$1264.78 in sales and Robison will be receiving \$189.72
- At the awards assembly on Friday, 10 students received Highly Proficient awards, 31 students received proficient awards, and 64 students received an award for increasing their proficiency level
- Title 1 allocations and budget meeting with District will be held at 9:00 am on February 14

**- Letter Grade Plan discussed in Site Council meeting:**

We need to move our proficiency up 12.3 points to be a B school. We need to move from 59.71 to 72.

We need to increase our growth points to at least 43. It is currently 33.32 but has been as high as 46.31.

We need to increase our proficiency points to at least 10. It is currently 7.39 but has been as high as 11.93.

- Teacher directed small group Tier 2 interventions are provided daily via direct small group instruction and/or in i-Ready for Math and ELA.
- RTI, Tier 3 pull-out small group or 1-1 interventions are provided Monday, Wednesday, and Friday via direct small group instruction and/or i-Ready for Math and ELA.
- By targeting our IIC students who are comprised of CUSP and ELL students, our RTI team will ensure that they have a year and a half of growth using i-Ready.
- Move the minimally proficient students to **at least** partially proficient.
- Track the district benchmark growth of the minimally proficient so that 25 minimally proficient students move to Partially Proficient.
- Maintain proficient and highly proficient students on benchmark.
- Second through fifth grade students will be responding weekly to writing prompts and writing across the curriculum. The final draft of the writing prompt will be typed. During PLCs, these writing samples will be analyzed and discussed to drive instruction.
- PBIS incentive to encourage attendance. When a class has daily perfect attendance, they will post a letter above their classroom door. Once they have spelled out “perfect” they will receive an incentive from the menu of options.

- Beginning in January, students will be completing the AASA sample problems in math and ELA.
